# Livestock-based options for healthy lives and sustainable environment: A One Health perspective

*Sessions at the European - Southeast-Asian Experts regional workshop on 'One Health in Action', Hanoi, Vietnam, 13 October 2014*

One Health is a broad movement that recognises that human, animal and ecosystem health are interdependent and that multidisciplinary collaborations are often necessary in order to attain optimum health solutions.

Particularly in Southeast Asia, One Health has gained much more attention due to the rise of cross-species epidemics, such as SARS, avian influenza, and Nipah virus. With 70% of emerging diseases of animal origin, this has become a crucial issue for Southeast Asia due to increasingly high urbanisation rates and dramatic expansion of livestock production.

Part of the ILRI@40 series, these sessions will highlight the One Health research and implementation experiences of ILRI and its partners in Southeast Asia. They will contribute to the 3 main workshop topics: One Health surveillance; One Health and EcoHealth research at the interface between wildlife, domestic animals and people; and One Health challenges around antimicrobial resistance.

During the first day of the workshop, Hung Nguyen (ILRI Vietnam) will represent ILRI in the welcome session, introducing its major research activities in Vietnam and the region. In the afternoon, Fred Unger (ILRI Vietnam) will discuss ILRI Ecohealth and One Health research outputs and outcomes in the region. During the three days, Jules Mateo (ILRI East and Southeast Asia) will run a booth with further information.

At the end of the first day, we are pleased to invite all participants to an ILRI@40 reception and dinner with ILRI senior collaborators and partners from the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development, the Ministry of Health and others.


